Highlights of the 2019 Session of the General Assembly were discussed:

- Changes in the Federal Tax Law caused a windfall at the state level. The following have been impacted:
 - ✓ Education
 - 5% teacher pay raise
 - Improvement in the student/counselor ratio
 - \$57 million to stabilize college tuition rate
 - ✓ Virginia Housing Trust Fund
 - \$4 million will go to families that are on the verge of becoming homeless.
 - √ \$10 million to go toward water pollution clean-up.
 - ✓ Transportation
 - There will be funding for improving and widening Interstate 81 from at least where Interstate 66 intersects with I81 down to the Blacksburg area.
 - o Trucks have to pay a fee to travel down I81 and this fee will be raised.
 - ✓ Non-partisan Re-districting Reform
 - A bipartisan committee consisting of two groups: eight legislators and eight citizens will discuss a new redistricting map. Two-thirds of each group must agree before a new map can be created.
 - ✓ A bill which would have made it illegal to use handheld personal communications devices while driving FAILED!!!!!
 - ✓ David Bulova will introduce a bill which will require new property developments as well as areas which are being re-developed to install sidewalks. Currently, this is not mandated.
