#### **Update on CCVCA Traffic and Parking Subcommittee**

# ST. MARY'S NEW CHURCH DESIGN UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED BY BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS

The County's Board of Zoning Appeals ("BZA") answered St. Mary's prayers on July 27, 2016, when it unanimously approved Special Permit Amendment SPA 77-A-041-04 for the latest design and alignment of St. Mary's proposed new sanctuary, rectory and fellowship hall. This latest design consists of an 18,500 SF sanctuary with a maximum height of 55.5 feet (depicted generally in the image below), 2,600 SF rectory, and 10,400 SF fellowship hall, which in total are about 15,000 SF smaller than the previously approved design. The county staff supported St. Mary's amended design and had recommended approval by the BZA in its July 20, 2016 Staff Report. Indeed, County Staff determined (and the BZA agreed) that St. Mary's latest proposed design is "in conformance with the land use recommendations of the Comprehensive Plan," "will continue to be in harmony with the purpose and intent of the R-1 District," "will not adversely affect the use or development of neighboring properties," and "has met all requirements of the Zoning Ordinance" (Report at pp. 17-18, 22). According to St. Mary's Pastor, Rev. James S. Barkett, the next step towards an eventual groundbreaking is for the church to work with its architects to complete the detailed architectural drawings necessary to construct the new church.

A "Bee Safe Neighborhood" is one in which a substantial number of homeowners agree to refrain from using pesticides harmful to bees. Honeybees are essential to our food supply, and approximately a third of the honeybees in Virginia have been dying each year. Since honeybees range as far as four miles, large chunks of land need to be poison free for them to survive. Maddie and Addie's mission is to protect our bee population by getting signature pledges from 75 homeowners in CCV. They plan to visit homes through early fall sharing information and raising awareness of the importance of pollinators. Once they reach their goal of 75 commitments, they plan to host a party! After a long delay, Giant Food has joined the renovation bandwagon and hopes to be open again in early 2017. Meanwhile, there are several new and interesting businesses at the mall.

**ORANGE THEORY FITNESS** – is currently selling memberships at their temporary office located on the lower level next to the ABC Store. Their facility will be next to Brion's on the upper level.

**ABC STORE** – is located on the lower level beside the veterinarian.

GIANT PHARMACY – is a temporary outlet for the Giant Pharmacy located on the lower level next to Kinkos.

**BOXCAR TAN BAR** – is located on the upper level behind Brion's.

**REV PILATES GYM** – is located on upper level behind Brion's.

**THE CAVE GAMING CENTER** – is located on upper level behind Brion's.

**TROPICAL SMOOTHIE CAFÉ** – is located next to the Giant entrance to the mall on the upper level.

**COMMUNITY ROOM**— when plans for the University Mall renovations first started, Supervisor Cook insisted there be space for community organizations to use for free. 
